

# Wild Art



**1.** Encourage Children to search for natural objects such as leaves, twigs, nuts, and stones, in your grounds or green space.

**2.** If you'd like them to focus on colour and tone, ask your students to match colours on colour charts. DIY store paint strips are ideal.
